WHO WE ARE

The Yards Gallery is an artist-run exhibition space and studio focused on awareness, community celebration, and steering the contemporary away from exclusivity. We're incredibly excited for our space to facilitate collaborative imaginings of all mediums. The Yards is a not-for-profit collective. We strive to make all events free and accessible; all voluntary contributions go towards maintenance, repairs, paying artists, and funding future endeavors.

The Yards was created in the summer of 2018 with the objective of providing a visible platform and welcoming space for emerging artists, curators, and activists. We thank contributors and supporters (you all!) of The Yards for making our mission possible.

Founders & current residents include Will Dryden, Yue Ren, and Antonio Linneman.

PROPOSAL PROCESS

We welcome proposals from all who are interested in organizing an exhibition, event, performance, or workshop that aligns with our mission. We're always interested in helping facilitate strange or unorthodox ideas that need space to manifest.

At this time, we are only accepting proposals for group exhibitions featuring two or more artists. We do not accept solo show proposals. Please note that we do not host exhibitions during the summer (May - July), though we will gladly still take applications for workshops, community events, etc.

As we work closely and collaboratively with curators/artists and value direct communication, we do not require you to adhere to a formal application form. However, we still have a list of necessary elements. Please feel free to contact us with any questions at any time at **theyardschicago@gmail.com**!

Here are the steps we would like potential proposals to follow:

- 1. Review this resource packet and create a document/folder (preferably through Google Drive) with the following information, making adjustments as necessary:
 - Working title
 - Statement/narrative
 - Artists and artwork, including individual artist bios/statements and CVs (if applicable)
 - Ideal timeline and flexibility with scheduling
 - Equipment or accomodations needed
 - Rough floor plans (see page 3 and 4)
 - Why you feel this event is important
- 2. Email the above to **theyardschicago@gmail.com** and include primary contact information.
- 3. Attend an upcoming event or schedule a meeting to familiarize yourself with the space and speak with us.

We will review your proposal and will generally follow up within 2 weeks. Though we would like to, we unfortunately cannot accept every proposal recieved. We apologize for this, and hope that all interested parties continue to be involved with the space.

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SAFETY

Because of safety/legal reasons, we cannot accommodate proposals including the following elements:

- Fire (small, controlled fires such as incense are OK)
- Destruction to the space or surrounding facilities
- Flooding or water damage
- Bodily fluids
- Violence and/or use of weaponry

Please take care when installing fragile artwork, as we are not responsible for damage caused to work by attendees or environmental circumstances during events. Ensure that anything precarious or installed to the walls/ceiling is secured safely.

We do not tolerate harassment of any kind. Individuals who are acting aggressive or discriminatory towards others will be removed.

RESOURCES

Unfortunately, we currently have limited funding available. Please plan on securing funding from outside sources if needed, though we will do our best to help as much as possible.

We have a variety of technology and equipment available for use, so please let us know what resources you would like from us and what you are able to provide or obtain yourself.

The Yards runs the bar for all events unless discussed otherwise. We generally do not charge at the door, but if you would like to accept donations on a sliding scale in order to cover costs or pay artists, please note that clearly in your proposal.

INSTALLATION & DEINSTALLATION

Upon acceptance, we will provide you with reasonable installation and deinstallation times/dates. We ask you to adhere to these timelines or request alternatives immediately, as we like preparatory work to be completed well ahead of the event/exhibition opening and are often running on a tight schedule. We are happy to assist with de/installation and cleanup!

DOCUMENTATION

We encourage all to find a designated photographer to take photos of the event and to document the work professionally for the artists. Please share these photos with us so that we may post them to our website and social media to promote and archive your event.


